



Milan and Expo 2015

Bocconi lies in the heart of Milan, a cosmopolitan, modern city that combines the best of Italy's yesterday and today. It is the country's business, design, fashion and music capital, and also rich in art, history and culture, such as the world-renowned La Scala Opera house, the huge gothic Cathedral Duomo, the medieval Castello Sforzesco and Leonardo Da Vinci's Last Supper.

Milan is the main financial, industrial and commercial center of Italy. It is this country's most international and dynamic city, where foreign-born citizens make up almost 17% of the resident population. Moreover, 25% of the total foreign students enrolled in Italian universities are in Lombardy, with 8 out of 12 Lombard universities located in the greater Milan area.*

Milan is also known as "The Fashion Capital of the World" for the many brands and shops that are based in the city. It is home to Italy's biggest banks and insurers, as well as the Italian Stock Exchange. The city offers a rich and diverse entrepreneurial sector, being home to almost 3,000 multinational companies that offer an ideal starting point for any international career. In fact, Milan was ranked 2nd in the 2014 QS Best Student Cities for Employer Activity ranking.

Located in a strategic position in Northern Italy, Milan is a gateway towards Europe and is close to a multitude of other interesting Italian cities and attractions. Venice and Florence are just a few short hours away by train. Skiing and the snow-capped Alps are just an hour north. The seaside and quaint villages of Liguria and "Cinque Terre" are also only a couple of hours away.

Finally, Milan is getting ready to host Expo 2015, a non-commercial Universal Exposition, around the theme of "Feeding the Planet, Energy for Life." Open from May to October 2015, the Expo will host over 130 participating countries and is expected to welcome over 20 million visitors, who will experience a unique journey around the world, sampling the food and traditions of people from all over the globe. Bocconi will be involved with events, meetings and student competitions related to the subjects of the Expo.

contacts that the University and faculty members have cultivated with companies and institutions all over the world, and getting support when entering the job market through various services and initiatives.

Teaching and Program Structure

Each academic year is divided into two terms (the Fall semester, from September to January, and the Spring semester, from February to June). Courses last one semester and exams are generally divided into two parts (with partial exams): this helps you keep up with your studies.

On average, class groups are made up of 120 students, and later in the program courses become more and more interactive with small group work, research and presentations assigned periodically. This gives classmates the opportunity to have a direct relationship with the faculty and other students in the program. Lectures are also generally held either in the morning or the afternoon, allowing time for individual study and group projects during the rest of the day. Attendance is not compulsory but it is strongly advised.

The study plan includes:

- **Compulsory courses**
- **Elective courses (chosen by the student)**
- **Two EU languages (compulsory for all programs)**
- **Computer Skills***
- **A final paper**

Each course is assigned a given number of credits, as you can see on the study plan of each program. One credit point corresponds to an average of 25 hours of work, divided as follows: 8-10 hours of classroom activities (lessons, exercises, seminars) and 15 hours of individual study.

The Bachelor of International Economics and Management and the Bachelor of International Economics and Finance share a common curriculum basis with the Bachelor programs in Italian (except for Economia e management per arte, cultura e comunicazione, which has a specific curriculum). If you are enrolled in one of the common

Studying at Bocconi is a challenging experience, but one that offers gratifying returns on the time and energy you will expend.

Your education here means:

- Entering an institution renowned for its **academic teaching and research**, a point of reference in the areas of business, economics and social sciences, both in Italy and abroad
- Being part of a **truly international community**, with students and teachers from all over the world, in a multicultural setting with an exchange of ideas and knowledge that is unmatched in the rest of Italy
- Learning from up-to-date and innovative content and **interactive teaching methods** with exercises, simulations, case studies, guest speakers and seminars
- Sharing our international approach by learning at least two compulsory EU languages, taking part in one of the many **international study and work abroad opportunities**, and studying every subject with an international perspective
- Connecting with the **professional world**, thanks to a network of

curriculum-based programs you have the opportunity to change your program after the first three semesters, depending on merit and availability of spots. Within the various programs, it is also possible to switch from a program taught in English to one in Italian or vice versa.

Foreign Languages

All Bocconi Bachelor programs require students to study two compulsory foreign languages. Students attending Bachelor programs taught in English can choose as their first foreign language either English or another EU language including French, German, Italian, Portuguese and Spanish. The first language course takes place during the first year, while the second language course will be completed during the second year of study. Students may choose from among French, German, Italian, Portuguese and Spanish as their second foreign language. Regular foreign language exams may be replaced with a valid international foreign language certificate, duly recognized by Bocconi, which will be assigned a grade.

Our Language Center also offers extracurricular language and culture courses in Arabic, Chinese, Japanese, Portuguese and Russian. All students have access to a language lab, a classroom set up for multimedia learning and practice materials.

International Opportunities

Each year, Bocconi offers undergraduate students a wide range of study abroad opportunities, including short-term programs such as Campus Abroad, which last one month during breaks in the academic year, and long-term programs such as Exchange programs, where participants attend a single term at a partner university during the 3rd year of the program (during the 4th or 5th year for Law students).

Bachelor students can also take part in Free Mover Summers, which last 3-5 weeks at international partner schools, while Law students can participate in the THEMIS program, which awards not only a Bocconi degree but also an international certificate issued by prestigious partner schools.

Heading to Work

Bocconi students are regularly prompted to get in touch with companies and the job market. A wide network of relations and an ongoing dialogue with the business community and professional settings from all sectors has been developed at the University, allowing for continuous interaction with the demands and changes of the market.

Bachelor program structures include the opportunity to replace one of the last elective courses with an **internship experience**: students can spend 3-12 weeks at an Italian or international company, experiencing functions and specific activities within the chosen area. The academic calendar has been organized to allow time for students to attend internships during the summer.

Furthermore, a series of programs and initiatives are organized by the Career Service both on campus and online, to help students get to know the job market and to help graduates get in touch with employers.

Bocconi&Jobs, the University's career event dedicated to recruiting, is held each year in Milan as well as in London and Shanghai: this is the major recruiting event organized to offer all Bocconi students the opportunity to meet Italian and international employers from all industry sectors.

Finally, **JobGate**, an online platform, is available to offer internships and placement opportunities dedicated to Bocconi students in Italy and abroad.



Program Features

The program structure starts with a similar curriculum basis as many of the other Bachelor programs, thereby giving you rigorous training in the key subjects, though always aiming for an international perspective. While attending core courses, you will study public and private organizations working at a global level, the main business functions (marketing, organization, technologies, finance, etc.) and strategic business management in an international context. The last part of the program is made up of 2 elective courses (one of which may be replaced with an internship) and the final report. During your last year, you may study at leading universities abroad and/or take part in internships in Italy or abroad, thus broadening your knowledge through courses and activities which are not included as part of the standard curricular subjects.

International Economics and Finance



Why choose this program?

- To understand and analyze **economics and finance topics** in an international perspective
- You get a solid education focused on the internationalization of **financial institutions**, the international economy and quantitative and qualitative tools
- You can choose between two majors. In the **Economics major**, a sound methodological preparation based on quantitative methods applied to social sciences goes hand in hand with applications to a large set of international issues (e.g. globalization, international economics, monetary economics and development economics)

Program Features

The first three semesters introduce you to the study of management, quantitative methods, accounting and finance and commercial law, always with a clear focus on the international aspects of these fundamental fields of knowledge. Then, the core courses focus on issues related to internationalization of businesses and financial institutions, the international economy, comparative European and international commercial law and quantitative and qualitative tools to study with a comparative perspective.

After the common curriculum courses, you can select one of the majors offered: Economics or Finance. During the final part of the program, you have the opportunity to further boost the international profile of your education by studying at leading universities abroad and/or taking part in internships in Italy or abroad. Internships, exchange programs and innovative teaching methods enable you to sharpen your problem solving approach and develop lateral thinking skills.

Why choose this program?

- You will learn how to interpret the evolution of social, economic and political systems in an international perspective, understand the mechanisms of decision-making within national and international institutions, and develop adequate skills for **implementing and evaluating policies**
- You will acquire a **toolbox of soft and hard skills** through active learning from a wide array of disciplines: politics, economics, management, law, history and quantitative methods. Large emphasis is placed on three moments of policy-making: designing public policies which are both economically efficient and politically sustainable; implementing public policies with an effective approach; evaluating public policies using modern quantitative and qualitative techniques
- The program is hence important for the development of abilities for future **national and international policy-makers**, active players in international organizations and regulatory authorities, and managers in international private firms dealing with an increasingly relevant non-market environment

Program Features

The first three years of the World Bachelor in Business's curriculum are composed of compulsory courses, which touch on a variety of topics according to the country of study and the special strengths of each school. During the fourth and final year, you may choose which of the three universities to attend to complete the program, focusing on your specific interests and objectives.

The study plan offers both a basic background in management integrated with rigorous economic, quantitative and legal subjects, in addition to a basic knowledge in public-private relations, international relations and country-specific issues. The program is enriched by the study of English, a second European language and the basics of Chinese. In addition, several additional subjects will be studied with the objective of improving general culture, ethics, social responsibility and respect for diversity and multiculturalism. This program has specific application and admissions procedures as well as dedicated fees, scholarships and accommodation (see page 31).

Bachelor Programs in Italian

Economia aziendale e management

This program is dedicated to students interested in analyzing the main issues regarding management of various kinds of companies and their functioning: manufacturing, distribution, services, public companies and non-profit institutions. Students learn about the management rationale of all business activities and their complex relations: strategy, which defines the underlying plan; marketing, which identifies the product or service to offer based on intuition and sophisticated needs and market analyses; production and logistics, which creates the product or service and make it available to customers; organization, which coordinates the people collaborating in the business; finance, which obtains and manages the financial resources required to carry out activities; and administration, control and IT systems, which provides managers with analyses and information required to make decisions.

Economia e finanza

This Bachelor program studies the components and main dynamics of the financial system. In addition to the shared topics in the field of economics and business, courses focus on the functioning of corporate finance and the methods with which companies can manage their investments and financing. The program also allows students to acquire a wide-ranging view of the workings of the economic system, financial markets (e.g. stock exchanges), intermediaries (commercial and investment banks, insurance companies, asset management companies, etc.) and financial instruments (e.g. stocks and options), with particular attention placed on international aspects and the close link between operational theory and reality.

Economia e scienze sociali

This program combines two fundamental elements: a large number of issues in the socio-economic area and a sound methodological preparation focused on qualitative tools (mathematics and statistics). The program is strongly oriented towards international issues, and teaches students to think about economics and social sciences rigorously, creating valid skills for all working environments: including commercial companies, investment banks, international bodies, research centers, government agencies and universities.

Economia e management per arte, cultura e comunicazione

The program combines a solid foundation in economics and business with several courses traditionally found in the study of the humanities. Though it is a management program that prepares students for a wide variety of career paths in various industries, its focus and teaching methods make it particularly suitable to students interested in artistic sectors (i.e. museums, theaters, auction houses), cultural areas (i.e. publishing, music, television), creative sectors (i.e. fashion, design, communication, urban development) and, in general, students with a strong interest in a variety of cultures and forms of expression. Milan, which is one of the world capitals for culture, design and fashion, is an ideal setting to complete this study program.

Giurisprudenza

Offered by the Bocconi School of Law, this 5-year program is built upon a solid legal foundation and provides a complete and in-depth education for accessing traditional legal professions. The program structure is also enriched by economic and business courses, which rounds out and enhances the profile of a modern professional in the field of law. Another unique aspect is its international focus, with the option of choosing a lot of elective courses in English and specific study and work abroad experiences.

LIFE ON CAMPUS

The Campus

Bocconi has a modern, urban campus, located in downtown Milan, just a 10-minute walk from the city center and the Navigli area, renowned for its vibrant nightlife. The University is fully equipped with up-to-date resources and facilities, providing a variety of cultural, social and sporting activities. It is undergoing constant transformation: over recent years, new buildings have been completed with more classrooms, offices and services. At the same time, Bocconi continues to invest in building student dormitories (a brand new residence will be open starting in September 2014), increasing the number of housing spots to students arriving from all over Italy and abroad.

With over **80 classrooms**, **1050 individual work stations**, **6 IT labs** and complete **Wi-Fi** coverage, the campus has thus become not only a reference point around which all activities connected to study and teaching rotate, but also the main place for getting together during student social, sports and cultural life.

The **One-stop service center** is a welcome point for all administrative procedures and a place where you can access the front offices for all services (including Admissions, Tuition and Fees, Student Services, etc.).

The Library

The Bocconi Library is the largest in Italy in economics and houses approximately 800,000 volumes and 25,000 periodicals in electronic and hard copy format. It has been recently expanded, providing students with 680 work stations located in 30 reading rooms and 30 rooms for group work. There is also now a remote digital reservation service for borrowing books and accessing many specialist collections and databases.





HOW TO APPLY

Overview

A total of 2600 places are available for first-year students in Bachelor programs and the Law program for the 2015-2016 academic year. Classes are made up of about 120 students each, except for the new Bachelor of International Politics and Government (60 students) and the Law program (150 students). International students have access to at least 50% of the places available in the Bachelor programs taught in English and up to 10% of all places in Italian programs.

The majority of first-year international applicants to Bocconi apply to our **Bachelor programs in English**. If you are fluent in Italian, you can also apply for any of our other degree programs held in Italian or pick Italian programs as your second and third choices on your online application, even if your first choice is one of the programs in English. The **World Bachelor in Business** has special admissions procedures, tuition and fees and scholarships, valid both for Italian and international applicants, which are outlined on page 31.

Admissions Procedures for International Applicants

Rounds

Before you start your application, **make sure you are an international applicant**:

- **International applicant**: if you are attending a school in a foreign country or an international school (in Italy or abroad)
 - **Italian applicant**: if you are attending an Italian school. See the admission procedures online at www.unibocconi.it/ammissioni
- Candidates can apply to one of the **admissions rounds** planned for the 2015-2016 academic year, which will start in September 2015.



Admissions Rounds

- **Early session – Discover Your Talent:**
7 April - 14 May 2014
- **1st round: 23 October 2014 - 15 January 2015**
- **2nd round: 16 January 2015 - 19 March 2015**

If you are attending your second-to-last year of high school (graduation in 2016) and you have an outstanding GPA for your 10th year (out of 12 years of education), you can participate in an Early Selection Session connected to the “Discover Your Talent Summer Program.” This gives you the opportunity to take the admissions test during the summer before starting your final year of high school. Selection Criteria

Applicants are evaluated on the basis of the following criteria:

- **Transcripts for the third-last and second-last years of secondary school**
- **An aptitude test: the SAT, ACT or Bocconi test**
- **CV and personal statement**
- **Certificates (e.g. language, IT)**

Aptitude Tests (SAT, ACT or Bocconi Test)

You can choose to either provide SAT or ACT scores or register to take the Bocconi test in Italy (Milan or Rome).

The **SAT Reasoning Test** is a standardized test for college admissions administered by the College Board; it measures literacy and writing skills that are needed for academic success in college. The SAT consists of three sections: Critical Reading, Mathematics, and Writing. Each section is assigned a score on the scale of 200–800. Bocconi code for the SAT: 7206

The **ACT (American College Testing)** measures high school students' general educational development and their ability to complete college-level work with a multiple choice test covering four skill areas: English, mathematics, reading and science. The four main tests are scored individually on a scale of 1-36, and a Composite score is also provided, which is the whole number average of the four scores. Bocconi is mainly interested in the ACT Composite score. For more

If you would like to take the SAT or ACT, be sure you apply for the exam as soon as possible. We recommend you take the SAT or ACT in the fall of 2014 so that results are available on time.

The **Bocconi test** lasts 90 minutes and involves 100 multiple choice questions which focus on various evaluation areas (e.g. critical reasoning, logical and mathematical items). The test can be taken in either Italian or English, according to the choice indicated by the applicant when completing the online application, regardless of the language of the program chosen (i.e. applicants can sit the test in Italian and apply to a program in English and vice versa). At www.unibocconi.eu/undergraduateadmission you will find a Bocconi test simulation and a guide to the Bocconi test.

Language and IT Certificates

Having one of the language (English, French, German, Spanish or Portuguese) or IT certificates recognized by Bocconi will be considered a supplementary element of evaluation. These certificates will be considered for the selection process only if previously completed and if sent (as a copy) by the deadline.

Financial Aid and Scholarships

The financial aid system provided by Università Bocconi includes various types of support. International applicants are offered:

- **Merit-based aid:** all applicants will be automatically considered for the **Bocconi Merit Awards** or **Bocconi International Awards**, based on the admission criteria. There is no need to file a separate application form.
- **Need-based aid:** for **Bocconi Scholarships** applicants must submit a specific application **by the same deadline** as the deadline for Bachelor programs applications.

The Admissions Process

1. Fill Out the Online Application

Visit www.unibocconi.eu/undergraduateadmission in order to access the online application form. You will have to register first, providing a valid email address; you will then be automatically assigned a personal ID and you will be able to choose your password. For the online application you will initially be asked to provide the following information:

- Choose your **first choice** of study program, plus second and third alternative choices
- Specify **which test** you want to submit (ACT/SAT or Bocconi test). If you opt for the Bocconi test, specify in which language you would like to take the test (English or Italian)
- Specify your **English language prerequisite**
- Specify any **other language certificates**, and/or **IT certificates** you will submit

Click on the “confirm” button in order to save the information and then upload all the documents needed for admissions.

2. Collect Documents and Upload Your Dossier

Then you will have to upload the following documents:

- Copies of the official certificate of **your SAT or ACT scores**: if you have not yet received your official SAT or ACT scores, you can submit a copy of the unofficial score and provide the official scores upon admission and enrollment
- Copies of your complete **secondary school transcripts** for the third-last and second-last years (with grading system conversions indicating highest possible grade and lowest passing grade), translated into English or Italian
- Copies of any **language and/or IT certificates**
- A **personal statement** of about one page
- A Curriculum Vitae (résumé)
- One **passport size color photo** attached to the proper form and signed in the provided space
- A copy of the 100 application fee **payment receipt** (to be paid online with a credit card using PAYTOOL)

Bocconi will not accept any application that does not include proper and complete documentation.

Lastly, you will be able to click on the “submit application” button to confirm and definitively save your application.

3. Sit the Bocconi Test (If Required)

International students can sit the Bocconi test in Milan (in February and April) or in Rome (in February only).

International admitted students will be invited to attend dedicated activities and events on campus.

Secondary School Diploma Requirements

If you are completing your secondary school education at a non-Italian high school, please keep the following Italian Ministry of Education, University and Research mandatory regulations in mind when applying and check the detailed regulations online:

- If your secondary school diploma was awarded after **10 or 11 years of education**, you will need to complete 1 or 2 years of college or university with all exams passed in order to enroll in the first year of a Bachelor program at an Italian university.
- The International Baccalaureate (IB) diploma, British A Levels, the European Baccalaureate, the French Baccalauréat and OIB (Option Internationale du Baccalauréat) and the German Abitur are valid for admission without a **declaration of value**. Please note that IB Certificates are not valid for enrollment and Bocconi only accepts Full IB Diplomas.
- National high school diplomas (except the ones listed above) must be **translated and legalized** by the Italian Embassy or Consulate in the country where the diploma was issued. The embassy or consulate will provide a **declaration of value** for the diploma.
- Please be aware that in order to enroll, students earning a **US High School diploma** will need to provide at least 5 AP courses in different subjects passed with a minimum grade of 3 out of 5. Please see the website for a list of subjects recognized by Bocconi.
- Students attending the **British school system** need to have at least 6 different subjects granted during GCSE and at least 3 A Levels.
- International applicants who are required to take a **qualifying academic exam** for university admission in their home country (e.g. Gao Kao, Veveosi Prosvasis, Matura, YGS) must pass that exam in order to enroll in an Italian university. Passing this exam will be verified when enrollment is finalized (September 2015).

English Language Requirements

To enroll in a **program taught in English**, students must meet one of the requirements listed online or have an English language certificate (at least **level B2** on the European Council scale – please check the minimum score required for each certificate online). To enroll in a **Bachelor program in Italian**, students must meet one of the requirements listed online or have an English language certificate (at least **level B1** on the European Council scale).

5. Enrollment: Confirm Your Place

To enroll and confirm your place in the program you have been accepted to, you will need to:

6. Entry Visas (for Non-EU Students Only)

All students with citizenship from countries outside the EU are required to apply for a student visa. To obtain a student visa, you must apply at the Italian Consulate in your country of citizenship, which will provide you with a list of the documents necessary to get your visa (visa requirements vary for each country and consulate). Please keep in mind that Italian authorities accept requests for student visas **only in May-June**. Once in Italy, within 8 days after your arrival, all international students must apply for a “**Permesso di Soggiorno**” (**Permit to Stay**). Upon arrival at Bocconi, specific sessions will be organized to support students in relocation procedures.

7. Final Enrollment

You will have to submit the following documents by the deadline available online:

- The original copy of your **secondary school diploma** (with any necessary declaration of value and/or translation)
- **Original** copies of the **English language prerequisite** (if not already submitted)
- **Official SAT or ACT scores** (if not already submitted)
- The **receipt** issued by the Italian post office to request a **permit to stay** if you are a **non-EU citizen**

Useful Information About Study Paths

Once enrolled in the first year of a Bachelor, students must earn at least **24 credits** (40% of first-year requirements) by July 2015 to begin the second year of the program. See the website for more information.

Students enrolled in one of the **common curriculum-based programs** have the opportunity to **change** their program after the first three semesters, based on merit and availability of spots. Within the various programs, it is also possible to switch from a program taught in Italian to one in English or vice versa.

Students enrolled in Bachelor programs taught in Italian are required to take at least **one course taught in English** during their studies.



Admissions Procedures for the World Bachelor in Business

The **World Bachelor in Business** is a four-year undergraduate degree program developed in partnership with the **USC University of Southern California-Marshall School of Business** and **The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology**.

In an effort to accommodate the different admissions schemes and schedules of various regions across the globe, applicants are allowed to submit their application through **any one of the three partner schools**. Admissions will be evaluated by a committee composed of members of the three universities. Each student should submit **one application only**. Applicants are advised to apply through the university where they want to be considered for admission to its other programs.

Students interested in **applying to both the World Bachelor in Business and the regular Bocconi Bachelor programs** must complete **two different applications**.

Timeline

- **Application deadline: 10 February 2015**
- **Admissions results: 1 April 2015**
- **Enrollment: by 1 May 2015**

Selection Criteria

- **High school transcripts** from grade 9 to 12
- **SAT scores (essay required)** or **ACT scores (with writing component)**
- **TOEFL** or other English language **certificates** (the complete list of recognized certificates is available at www.unibocconi.eu/wbb)
- **Curriculum Vitae (Activities Summary)**
- **Personal Statement**
- **Recommendation Letter** from a school counselor or teacher

The Admissions Process

Students can apply through the Bocconi website and the online application available at unibocconi.eu/wbb

Applicants are required to submit an **application fee** of 100 before completing the online application process. It must be paid online with a credit card using PAYTOOL before submitting the application form. At the discretion of the admissions committee, personal interviews

or video interviews may be required for admission consideration, as well as other supplementary materials and information. Each of the schools will communicate admissions results to the candidates who applied through them.

Upon admission, each of the three schools is committed to providing support throughout the enrollment process, which will take place through the USC Web Portal for all candidates.

Tuition and Fees and Scholarships

Each year, students must submit payments to the host university according to the table below.

The tuition and fees for the **4th year** will be based on an average of costs for the three universities.

Merit scholarships covering 50% or 25% of annual tuition and fees are available from the three schools. Evaluation for scholarships will occur automatically and at the same time as admissions selections: students therefore do not need to complete a separate application.

All students with **European citizenship** enrolled in the World Bachelor in Business program can apply for a **dedicated loan with a major European bank**. Details are available online.

The host school assists incoming students in finding suitable **accommodation** and in adjusting to the local culture and environment. All three universities provide various residence halls both on campus and within a short distance, as well as support to current students, such as help with visas, residence permits, support with enrollment and administration issues, welcome activities, tutoring, etc.

Financial Aid and Scholarships

The financial aid system provided by Università Bocconi includes financial assistance which varies according to type of applicant, and which is adjusted to the family's financial-asset conditions and the student's academic profile. An overview of financial aid opportunities reserved to **international students** is included in this publication; detailed information is available on the Bocconi website.

Bocconi Undergraduate Merit Awards and Bocconi International Awards

Bocconi Merit Awards and **Bocconi International Awards** are offered to outstanding students by Università Bocconi, in cooperation with partner companies and institutions. The awards provide recipients with valuable financial support, ensuring they can enjoy the benefits of a top-quality academic experience, regardless of their financial situation. The **Bocconi Merit Award** includes a full tuition waiver, along with housing for the first 2 years. The **Bocconi International Award** consists of a 50% reduction in tuition. Both the Merit Award and the International Award will be renewed each year if merit requirements are maintained. All international candidates applying to a Bocconi Bachelor program will be automatically considered for these awards. There is no need to file a separate application form.

University Tuition and Fees

Tuition and fees for each year of a Bachelor degree at Bocconi are set at approximately 11,000 per year, which is equal to the 4th income bracket. In order to ensure a fair system for tuition and fees, Università Bocconi sets **3 additional income brackets** adjusted to the economic and patrimony conditions of the student's original and de facto family that allow for reduced tuition fees.

To be assigned a reduced income bracket, students need to provide documents related to the family's income and assets by the date set (please carefully check deadlines online).

In order to identify individual income brackets using the evaluation method established by Università Bocconi, applicants should refer to the parameters, regulations and documentation indicated on the website of the Tuition and Fees Office. Please be sure that proper and complete documentation is provided by the set deadlines. Documents need to be completed and translated into Italian.

Income brackets will be assigned as a result of the Tuition and Fees Office evaluation of the documents provided by students. Confirmation of the assigned income bracket will be communicated from the end of September 2015.

Bocconi Scholarships for International Students (Non-Italian Citizens Only) Need-Based

Non-Italian citizens enrolling for the first time in the first year of an undergraduate degree at Bocconi may apply for the **Bocconi Scholarship for International Students**. It consists of a **full tuition and fees waiver** that may be renewed for a maximum of 3 academic years (for Bachelor programs) or 5 academic years (for the Law program). To participate in the **selection process**, applicants must have **non-Italian citizenship, residence abroad and a non-Italian secondary school diploma** earned in Italy or abroad. Complete application requirements and regulations for the Bocconi Scholarship for International Students are available online starting in October. **Applications must be submitted by the same deadline of the applicant's selected Bocconi admissions session.**

Other Financial Aid and Scholarships

- **Exemption from Payment of University Tuition and Fees for Students with Disabilities**

Students with a physical disability equal to or greater than 66% certified by an Italian Medical Commission are completely exempt from payment of tuition and fees.



- **Grants for International Programs**

In order to encourage student participation in international mobility programs organized by the University, financial support is made available to anyone meeting merit and economic requirements established by the relevant Application Requirements and Regulations.

- **Grants for International Internships and Off-Campus Internships at Public Organizations in Italy**

Different forms of assistance are available from Università Bocconi for students who participate in unpaid internships held abroad, or off-campus internships held at an Italian public institution. Internships must be organized by Università Bocconi and students must meet economic and merit requirements to participate.

- **Scholarships and Graduation Awards from Public and Private Organizations**

Each year, public and private organizations establish scholarships and graduation awards through Università Bocconi. Rules and regulations are available on the Bocconi website.

Student Loans

The University has secured agreements with major credit institutions to offer students enrolled in Bocconi degree programs a way to finance their education with a low interest loan. Loan applications can be made at any time throughout the academic year.

- **UniCredit ad Honorem from UniCreditBanca**

This loan is aimed at Bocconi students who are residents in Italy and have EU or non-EU citizenship. It can be accessed starting in the **first year** of an undergraduate degree program.

- **IntesaBridge from Intesa Sanpaolo**

This loan is aimed at all Bocconi students who are **EU citizens**. It can be accessed starting in the **second year** of the program.

- **BPM Loan for University Studies**

Banca Popolare di Milano has created two loan options for both EU and non-EU students who are enrolled in a Bocconi degree program.

- **Deutsche Bank Loan**

German students who have completed an Abitur diploma in Germany and who enroll in a Bocconi degree program can access a low interest loan with Deutsche Bank by directly contacting a bank branch in Germany.

- **Federal Student Aid for US Citizens**

Bocconi has been approved by the US Federal Government for participation in the Direct Loan Program. This means US citizens can apply for a federal loan while studying at Bocconi. Housing

Università Bocconi offers students approximately 1600 rooms in one of its 6 University Residence Halls.

The majority of rooms are reserved for full rate housing: assignments for the first year are based on a first-come, first-served basis. Approximately 500 rooms are reserved for reduced rate housing; access to this kind of housing is based on the economic situation of the student's family. Reduced rate housing applications are expected to be available in July.


