

Assistant Professor in History of Art

The Department of Policy Analysis and Public Management at Bocconi University opens a position of Assistant Professor in History of Art (Italian Scientific Sector L-ART/01 STORIA DELL'ARTE MEDIEVALE; L-ART/02 STORIA DELL'ARTE MODERNA; L-ART/03 STORIA DELL'ARTE CONTEMPORANEA), starting from February 1st, 2015.

The successful candidate is expected to promote and contribute to the growth of his/her field and of History of Art more broadly and to actively participate in the Department research activities; to take responsibility for Departmental undergraduate and postgraduate teaching in the history of art across a broad chronological range; to supervise graduate students at masters level, and, where necessary, at doctoral level; and to play an active role in supporting the academic and cultural activities of the university training programmes and research.

Contracts will run for up to eight years (with one paid sabbatical year and subject to renewal after the first three years), with the possibility of promotion to a tenured position by the end of the period or earlier in case of outstanding performance.

Applicants must be fluent in English. Candidates could be asked to teach Italian classes. Commitments include teaching and research. As the appointed candidate is expected to publish in international refereed journals, priority will be given to applicants with international research experience.

Applicants should hold (or be close to completion) a Ph.D. in History of Art and related fields and should have demonstrated strong potential in research and teaching.

Candidates should also demonstrate the capabilities and the skills to understand and fully interact with the research activities and the disciplines embodied in a public policy and management Department (e.g. economics, management, statistics, public policies, economic history). The ideal candidate will be able to demonstrate engagement with both disciplinary and interdisciplinary research and an active interest in areas as, for instance:

- Artistic production and political and institutional identities;
- Geographies of artistic and cultural exchanges
- Notion of values and their development over time.

Compensation and teaching load are competitive with other top European academic institutions.
