



LECTIO INAUGURALIS AVVOCATO GIOVANNI AGNELLI ASSOCIATE PROFESSORSHIP IN ECONOMICS COMPETITION AND MONOPOLY FROM MICROECONOMICS TO MARKET DESIGN

There is a growing debate on both sides of the Atlantic about whether industry concentration and market power are increasing and what are the implications for business dynamics, investments and labor. This Lectio Inauguralis will provide academic and policy perspectives on this topic. It will discuss the role that economic research, and especially the relatively new branch of microeconomics known as "market design," can play to fix market failures and help revisit antitrust tools for an effective competition policy in both traditional and high-tech markets.
