Introduction

The course (24 hours) is aimed at beginners and is intended to provide the basics of the Chinese language standard (Putonghua), spoken.

The course runs in the 1st and 2nd semester: every student receives details about how and when to apply via yoU@B Diary. When the enrollment period is over, applicants will receive confirmation of their acceptance/non-acceptance on the course.

This activity is limited to 50 participants. Registrations cannot be carried out once this number has been reached or after closing of the registration period.



Syllabus

The course focuses on the analysis of real situations, video, and oral and written pieces, in order to offer students an introduction to the Chinese language and culture.

Objectives of the course:

- Learning the basis of linguistic elements;
- Introducing the Chinese culture.

Lessons	Content
Lessons 1-2	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Introduction: Chinese characters and phonetic transcription (pinyin and tones)• Greetings (How do you do?)
Lessons 3-5	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Practice of pronunciation, notes on pinyin spelling• Using computer keyboard to write Chinese characters• Greetings (How is your health? Are you busy with work?)• Grammar: questions with “吗”
Lessons 6-8	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Order of strokes in Chinese character writing;• Making an acquaintance (self-introduction)• Grammar: questions with interrogative pronouns
Lessons 9-10	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Introduction of Chinese culture• Making an acquaintance (What is your name?)• Grammar: the sentence with an adjectival predicate
Lessons 11-12	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Introduction of Chinese culture• Making an acquaintance (Let me introduce...)• Grammar: the sentence with a verbal predicate

For successful learning outcomes, it is recommended that students complete autonomously the exercises of the manual during the course.

Teaching Mode

It will be possible to join the course in distance, by connecting remotely and following the streaming of the lesson.
