Assistant Professor in Economic History

The Department of Social and Political Sciences at Bocconi University invites applications for a faculty position at Assistant Professor level in Economic History (Sc 13/C1) with an appointment beginning on **September 1, 2020**. The area of specialization is business history and international history. Suitable candidates have a doctoral degree in history and a postdoctoral track record of independent research and teaching on economic and business history and international history. The ideal candidate can demonstrate experience in working with various types of primary (archival) sources across different countries and different languages.

Bocconi University is a leading European research and teaching institution in economics, social sciences, management and related disciplines. The Department of Social and Political Sciences has a major role in staffing an undergraduate program in International Politics and Government, and master's programs in Politics, Public Policy, and Economic and Social Sciences. The successful candidate is expected to teach at both the undergraduate and graduate level.

Bocconi provides an ideal interdisciplinary research environment. The Department of Social and Political Sciences combines faculty from several allied disciplines and fields of study—public administration, political science, sociology, economics, history, public health, demography—who share an interest policy-relevant research. The Department counts 60 tenured or tenure-track faculty members. Bocconi is located in Italy's most vibrant center, Milan, a historic, cosmopolitan and international city in a metropolitan area of 3 million that is well connected to the rest of Europe and the world.

Knowledge of Italian is not required. Applicants should hold or expect a PhD in economic history, economics or equivalent before **September 1, 2020**. The successful applicant will have to demonstrate strong potential in research and an ability to publish in top international journals in business history and general economic history. Terms of employment are competitive.

Candidates may be interviewed or invited to give a job talk at Bocconi. To ensure full consideration, applicants must submit: a. a scientific curriculum; b. up to 3 titles, publications and documents which the candidates intend to submit for this evaluation; c. the name of at least three highly qualified academic referees.
