Abstract:

In recent years, information campaigns (IC) have increasingly served as tools to manage and externalize Europe's borders. Nevertheless, scant research has delved into the perceptions and opinions held by prospective migrants with regard to these campaigns and whether such perceptions influence their decision to migrate. This paper, based on an analysis of 64 individual interviews and 4 focus groups, seeks to



comprehend the perspectives of potential migrants concerning Europe's stringent migration policies and the opportunities to migrate in "legal" ways. The findings reveal that prospective migrants often construct a prevailing narrative of Europe as a developed and democratic continent, a perception that seemingly justifies the European Union's approach as a way to protect their welfare states, despite evidence suggesting that it does not significantly impact their intent to migrate. Conversely, colonial grievances persist prominently among prospective migrants, as does their insistence on the fundamental right to freedom of movement. This study unveils the multifaceted and interconnected factors that underlie the motivations of prospective migrants to pursue migration, even in the face of the increasingly restrictive measures adopted by the European Union.
